PREAMBLE TO THE INDIAN CONSTITUTION

WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:

JUSTICE, social, economic and political;

LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship;

EQUALITY of status and of opportunity; and to promote among them all FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation;

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, do HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

SCHOOL BUSES

The school has deployed own bus fleet for the purpose of transport for students from the academic year 2022-2023 onwards. All personnel on the bus fleet including managers, drivers, conductors (males) and caretakers (females) are employees of the school and the entire service will be directly under the control of the school. This has been done to ensure unprecedented, best of the services to the students and parents.

It is notable to mention that all the buses are brand new of TATA and Force Tempo-Traveller make. All the buses are completely in conformance with RTO norms, rules and regulations and are best suited for commute of children. The bus service is being provided with the following features:

- 11. Direct Communication between Bus personnel and Parents
- 12. Well trained drivers and support staff
- 13. Regular training and health check up of bus staff for smooth and safe operations



RULES AND REGULATIONS

ADMISSION

- A student seeking admission to std I must complete 6 years of age as on 16th December. A corresponding scale of age is fixed for the subsequent standards.
- 2. Students seeking admission to the school for the first time should produce a bonafide certificate from the previous school and his/her birth certificate or other satisfactory proof of age issued by a Competent Authority.
- 3. Every student seeking admission to the school from other schools should produce a leaving certificate from the previous school at the most within a week of joining. If he/she comes from a school outside the State of Maharashtra the leaving certificate must be counter-signed by the Education Officer of the State in which the previous school is situated.
- 4. Students belonging to the Backward Classes, Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe should produce a certificate from the Competent Authority.
- 5. Admission to the various classes will be governed by the school rules in force from time to time.

What is expected from a student

- 6. Every student must be present in the school premises ten minutes before school begins, to attend the daily prayer assembly.
- 7. Students must be in school uniform, clean in their person, dress and belongings; otherwise they will be sent home.
- 8. Students must be present on the re-opening day after the vacations.
- Students must be present in the school/Sri Ma Stadium on Independence Day/Republic Day. Disciplinary action will be taken against the students who remain absent. Also they will be fined Rs.200/.
- 10. Irregular attendance, habitual negligence in studies, malpractice in the examination, dishonesty, disrespect and

disobedience to the authorities and any other habit or activity/behaviour (whether inside or outside the school premises) considered by the Principal as unbecoming of a student, will attract the extreme penalty of dismissal.

- Any damage done by a student to school furniture, laboratory equipment or other articles will have to be fully compensated by parents / guardians. The decision of Principal, regarding the penalty, shall be final.
- 12. Co-curricular activities, visits and excursions are compulsory for the students. Absence will not exempt them from payment of charges.
- 13. Students should be careful not to throw any paper, fruit-rinds or pips etc. in the school premises except in the baskets or bins specially provided for this purpose. Littering in the school premises is a serious offence and is liable for punishment.
- 14. Running, playing, fighting, shouting, skating, sliding, walking over the desks etc. in the school are bad manners, and are never allowed. The students indulging in these are liable for punishment/fine.
- 15. When moving along the corridors, as also when changing class rooms, the pupils must walk in silence and in a single unbroken line. They should always keep to the left.
- 16. Students are liable to be punished or fined individually/collectively at the discretion of the Principal for breach of school rules or indifference to classwork and homework.
- 17. Students should not scribble anything in their notebooks, textbooks and desks. Such books are liable to be confiscated whereas damage done unto desks shall be penalised.
- 18. Time-Table is meticulously planned so as to not burden students. Bringing study material as is prescribed in the Time Table and that for which specific instructions are given before hand is mandatory. Periodic checking of school bags will be carried out after which penalties will be levied on students carrying extra burden. Students are also strictly discouraged from carrying any item other
- 19. Students of Stds. X who do not submit their journals and other books on time will be fined Rs. 250/- per subject for practicals and evaluation.

20. School students must not bring mobile or smart phones, Ipods/ music players or tablets or smartwatches or any other gadgets with them to the school or for any school related activity within or outside the school premises including school excursions. Students will be fined Rs. 1000/- if any of the above are found on their person.



- 21. For security reasons parents/guardians will strictly not be allowed to enter the school premises without the ID card issued for parents/guardians by the school. All parents/guardians are requested to kindly cooperate with the security personnel for the same and make register entries at the gate for every visit. Please note no one will be allowed to take children with them without presenting ID card. This is being done for the safety of all children.
- 22. Students are responsible for the safe custody of their books and belongings. Students also should not come to school wearing or possessing valuable articles.
- 23. Students suffering from any infectious or contagious diseases will not be allowed to attend the classes/examinations.
- 24. Student should not wear any wrist watch to school, even during examinations.
- 25. Parents/Guardians should enforce discipline at home and ensure that their children / wards:
- (a) Are regular and punctual in attending classes;
- (b) Come to school in clean, well-pressed and proper uniform with the Hand Book and other necessary books and stationery;
- (c) Do their home-work and prepare their lessons daily as per the Hand- Book.
- (d) Take active interest in the activities of the school.
- 26. Parents/Guardians are not allowed to arrange private tuitions with school teachers (the teachers of this school are also not allowed to accept tuitions) without the written permission of the Principal. Also, the teacher cannot be tutors to the students of their own class.
- 27. On a prescribed application form available in the school, requests for Railway Concession, and permission to take tuitions, may be granted.
- 28. Parents/Guardians are not allowed to meet the students or the class teachers during the school hours, without the prior permission of the Principal.

- 29. Attention of Parents/Guardians is particularly invited to the fact that, if in spite of periodic reports, no tangible improvement is observed in their children/wards the school will take action against such pupils as they deem fit, which may include removal of the pupils from the school.
- 30. Parents/Guardians should address all communications to the Principal.
- 31. Parents/Guardians may please note that they cannot dictate terms to the school. The Principal reserves the right to stipulate conditions on which students will be admitted or retained in the school.
- 32. The school office maintains a record of the addresses and contact details (including email address) of Parents/ Guardians. They are requested to promptly intimate the changes, if any, from time to time to up-date the record. PARENTS NOT HAVING EMAIL ADDRESSES ARE REQUIRED TO CREATE THEM URGENTLY AND INTIMATE THE SCHOOL OFFICE.
- 33. Medical examination of the students will be done annually by school Doctor. Parents/Guardians should arrange for the immediate follow-up treatment when advised by the Doctor.
- 34. Any Parent / Guardian needing additional information or clarification about the school regulations is requested to contact the Principal with prior appointment.
- 35. Parents'/ Guardians' co-operation in implementing these rules is necessary not only for the benefit of the student but also for the smooth working of the school.
- 36. Parents/Guardians should regularly see and note the remarks in their wards' Hand Book and sign their reports. Failure to do so may put their children to great inconvenience and render them liable to be kept out of the class, fined/sent home.
- 37. Parents should not send sweets/chocolates to school for celebrating birthdays. The school also encourages the act of donating one story book by the student to the classroom library on birthdays. This act of kindness holds a special memory for the child, as their gift continues to be collectively enjoyed and benefit many.
- 38. Attention of Parents/Guardians is particularly invited to the fact that the school Management reserves the right to alter or modify any or all of these rules, at any time, without prior notice.

(A) UNIFORM

Students should wear the uniforms as prescribed by the school. It should be washed well, wrinkle-free and worn tidily.

Students coming with torn dress or faded uniforms will not be allowed.

Any changes to prescribed uniforms will be notified by school authorities from time to time.

- (b) **Identity Card:** All students should wear the Identity Card prominently. The Identity Card must be maintained in Prime condition by the students.
- (c) Ribbons : Girl students will use prescribed ribbons and hairband.
- (d) **Hair :** Should be well kept and neatly combed. Boys will have their hair cut short; long and flowing hair will not be allowed.
- (e) **Nails:** Students will keep their nails clean and trim them short. Nail polish not allowed.
- (f) Sweater: Student shall wear Navy Blue sweaters during the winter season.
- (g) **Scout & Guide Uniform:** Student should wear the prescribed scout & guide uniform whenever they have their classes and also when they are called on duty.
- 40. Parents should pay special attention to the outfit of their wards regularly. On the examination days there will be a special inspection of outfit.Failure to send children with proper outfit may put them to great inconvenience and render them liable to being sent home or fined.
- 41. No complaint regarding outfit will be entertained.

EXAMINATION / PROMOTIONS

42. Promotion to higher standard is decided strictly on merit and the conduct of the student in the school. The decision of the school authorities in matters of promotion will be final and no representation from parents/guardians will be entertained. Students remaining absent for any exam



will not be re-examined. Students found copying or assisting others in copying shall be detained from appearing for remaining examinations. Their papers will not be evaluated.



- 43. Evaluation will be done strictly on the basis of periodical oral tests, class tests, Unit tests, First Semester and Final Examinations, Home assignments and outfit, etc.
- 44. Students who have not put in at least 75% of the attendance for each term are liable to be detained.

LEAVE AND ABSENCE

- 45. Absence, without prior permission, will be seriously viewed.
- 46. Students so absent will not be allowed to enter the class-room without the Principal's permission and without a written explanation in the Leave/ Absence Record by their parents/ guardians.
- 47. Truancy must be checked by the parents. If any student remains absent from the school for more than five days continuously without permission, his/her name will be struck off the rolls.
- 48. As a rule, he/she will not be re-admitted. If he/she is re-admitted, which will be totally at the discretion of the Principal, admission fee will be charged again.
- 49. A Medical Certificate should be sent along with the student in case of medical absence on the resuming day.

FEES

50. From the coming academic year (2024-25), fees for all standards (Jr. Kg. to Std. 12) shall be payable in three instalments.

1st Instalment - Between April 1st to 10th2nd Instalment - Between July 1st to 10th3rd Instalment - Between November 1st to 10th



Late payment of fees shall be leviable if fees remain unpaid beyond the 10th of the said month

Those parents who wish to continue paying fees monthly shall be required to pay fees via e-Mandate (Nach E-Mandate) auto-debit system. Online Registration process will need to be completed for the same with the banks. This measure intends to make payment of school fees a smooth process for parents, eliminating the need for repeated reminders from the school.

School Bus/ Transportation Fees shall also be payable accordingly as mentioned. The same will be CHARGEABLE for an entire semester i.e. April to October and October to March (irrespective of the date of availing of service) and shall remain payable alongwith school fees for the sake of convenience of parents. Likewise, school bus service once availed cannot be withdrawn for the above period.

- 51. Fees for the full year will have to be paid by students taking admission at any time during the year. Fees is an annual sum and is not attributable to any set of months.
- 52. Fees for the month of February & March must be paid in February before the commencement of Annual Examinations.
- 53. Parents/guardians **SHOULD NOT EXPECT TO BE REMINDED BY THE SCHOOL** in respect of unpaid fees.
- 54. Students will not be allowed to sit for the examinations unless their dues have been cleared.
- 55. Fees will not be accepted via cheque. Fees can be paid via Demand Draft.
- 56. If payment of fees is done by demand draft and if for any reason stop payment is initiated then any charges towards the presentation of the said instrument shall be leviable on the parent.
- 57. We strongly urge payment of fees via the online mode.

Overdue Date: Corresponding 10th of the said month will be the overdue date post which fine shall be levied on delayed payment of fees. Fine will be levied per instalment (whether monthly or tri-instalments) from the 1st day after the Overdue date i.e., from 11th of the said month. Fine will be for a period of a month flat and will not be calculated pro-rata

Quantum of Late Fee Fine: 2% per month for each instalment. The same shall be levied month after month till pending fee instalment is cleared
Example: If fees for April month is defaulted then 2% fine will be levied on the April amount. Subsequently if fee for May month is also defaulted then 2% for month of May will also be levied over and above for the default of the month of April. The second 2% for the April month late fee will not be levied if paid on or before 10th May i.e., of subsequent month. Till it is cleared 2% additional late fee on the April month Fee amount will keep getting levied month after month. This is applicable even for the tri-instalments scheme.

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Charges for Duplicates, Certificates & Extracts

- 59. A fee of Rs. 50/- will be charged for issuing any extract from the school records. After receipt of the application and the charges thereof the extract will ordinarily be issued within four days.
- 60. A Fee of Rs. 50/- will be charged for the application form for the Leaving Certificate and the leaving certificate will ordinarily be issued within 10 days.
- 61. A fee of Rs. 500/- will be charged for issuing duplicate marksheet and Rs. 2000/- for duplicate leaving certificate. After receipt of an affidavit and charges thereof the certificate will ordinarily be issued within 10 days.
- 62. A Fee of Rs.500/- will be charged for issuing the first copy of Transcript. Thereafter for every additional copy of Rs. 100/- will be charged.

RULES FOR WITHDRAWAL

- 63. On a prescribed application form available in the school, requests for Leaving Certificate should be applied by both the parents.
- 64. After receiving the request for a leaving certificate, it will be ordinarly issued after 10 working days.
- 65. The withdrawal at the end of the academic year should be intimated in the month of January. Failure to intimate the same will attract the fee for the month of April and May.
- 66. Fees for the full term must be paid at the time of leaving the school in case of withdrawal in the middle of the term. Under no circumstance will the fees be refunded.
- 67. Withdrawal from the school will disgualify the pupils from any prize or award.
- 68. While withdrawing any student from the school, Leaving Certificate is issued only after receiving a 'No Dues Certificates' from the library as well as the fee office.

LIBRARY RULES

- 69. All students of the school are members of the library.
- 70. A student can borrow only one book at a time for a period of two weeks.
- 71. Books will be issued to the students, during the library periods. No book will be issued or returned during the



teaching hours.

- 73. In case of misuse of book, wrongly handled or lost, the person concerned will have to replace the book or pay the full price of the book.
- 74. A student not returning all the borrowed books before annual examination shall not be allowed to sit for the examination.
- 75. A student's record of library books read through the year will add to his/her Internal Assessment Grade.
- 76. Parents should encourage their wards to develop reading habits.

PTA (Parent Teacher Association) Executive Committee

- 77. All parents and teachers are a part of the Parent Teacher Association of the School.
- 78. An Executive Committee of the Parent Teacher Association is to be formed every academic year for the smooth functioning of the PTA.



- 79. The process of formation of the new Executive Committee is commenced at the beginning of each academic year.
- 80. Parents who are interested in being a part of the Executive Committee are requested to collect and fill in the Nomination Form during the first Parent Teacher's Open Day meet.

Rules for the P.T.A. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE FORMATION

- a) All the parents and teachers are, by default, members of the P.T.A.
- b) The parents who have been members of P.T.A. Executive Committee CANNOT file nomination for 2 consecutive academic years after the academic year in which they have been a member.
- c) Selection will be by drawing of lots for selection of 1 member per standard (not division) to constitute the PTA Executive Committee.
- d) An Executive Committee will be formed which will consist of :
 - Chairperson Principal
 - Vice Chairperson One from amongst the parents
 - Secretary One from amongst the teachers
 - Two Joint Secretaries Both from amongst the parents
 - Members One parent and one teacher from every standard
- e) The tenure of the Executive Committee of the PTA shall be one academic year.



- f) The Executive Committee shall meet at least once in 3 months.
- g) The PTA Executive Committee members should compulsorily attend all meetings scheduled through the year.

BUS

- 81. It is compulsory for parents of pre-primary and primary students to either come personally or send authorised guardians to drop/pick up students to/ from bus stop.
- 82. Parent/guardian should produce the parent Identity card provided by the school at the time of dropping/ picking up the student to/from the bus stop. Guardian form must be duly filled and submitted in the school office.



- 83. At the time of dropping the student back home, in case the ID card is not produced, then the student will be brought back to school. The parent/ guardian will have to then come personally to the school for picking the child. ID card will have to be produced even at this time.
- 84. In case the parent is late to drop the student at the bus stop, then the bus will not wait beyond the stipulated time. Parents will have to drop the child to the school on their own. School/bus service operator cannot be held responsible in such situations.
- 85. Student should wear the proper ID card provided to them for boarding the bus. Whenever asked suitable proof of payment of bus fees (bus fee card) will have to be furnished.
